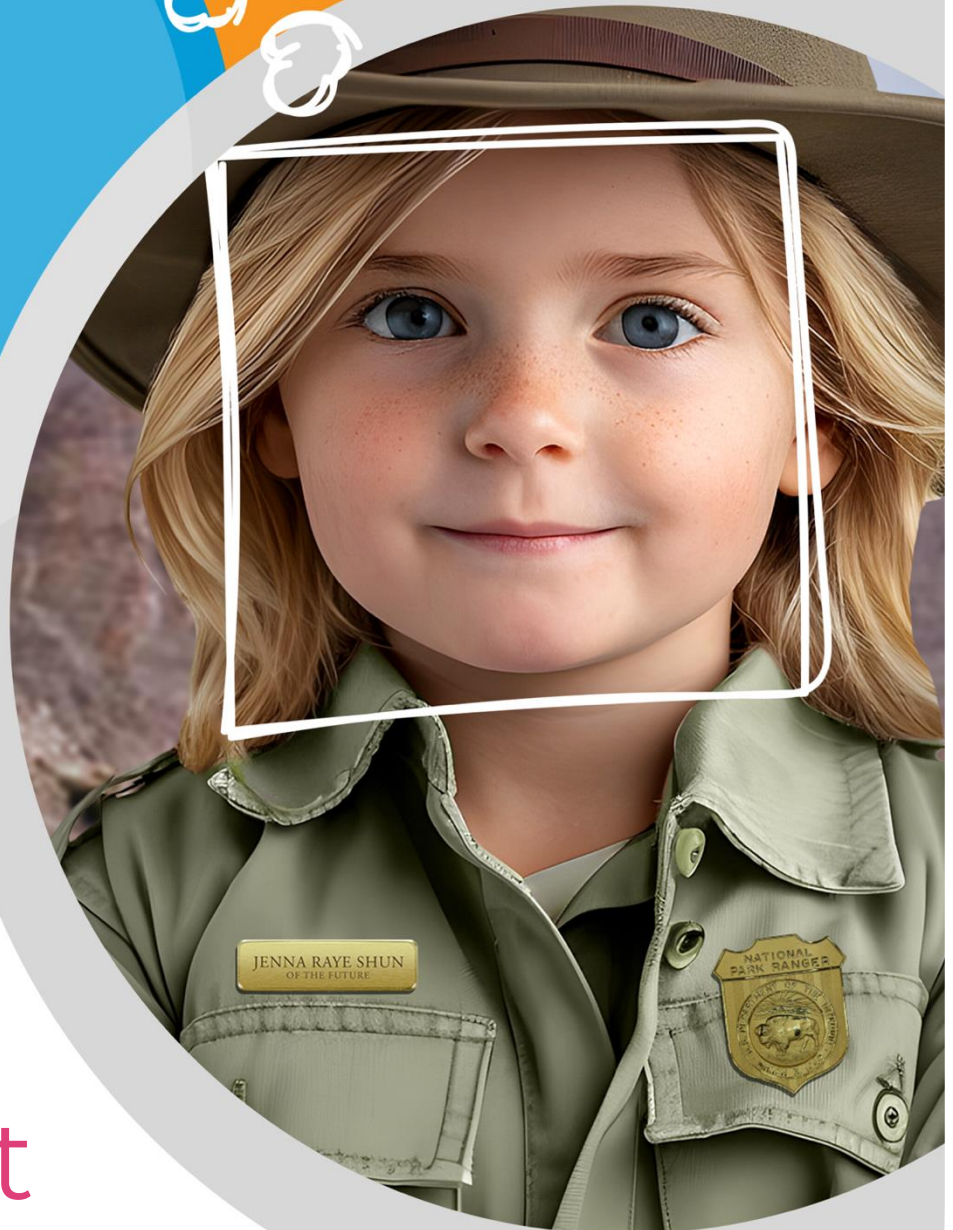

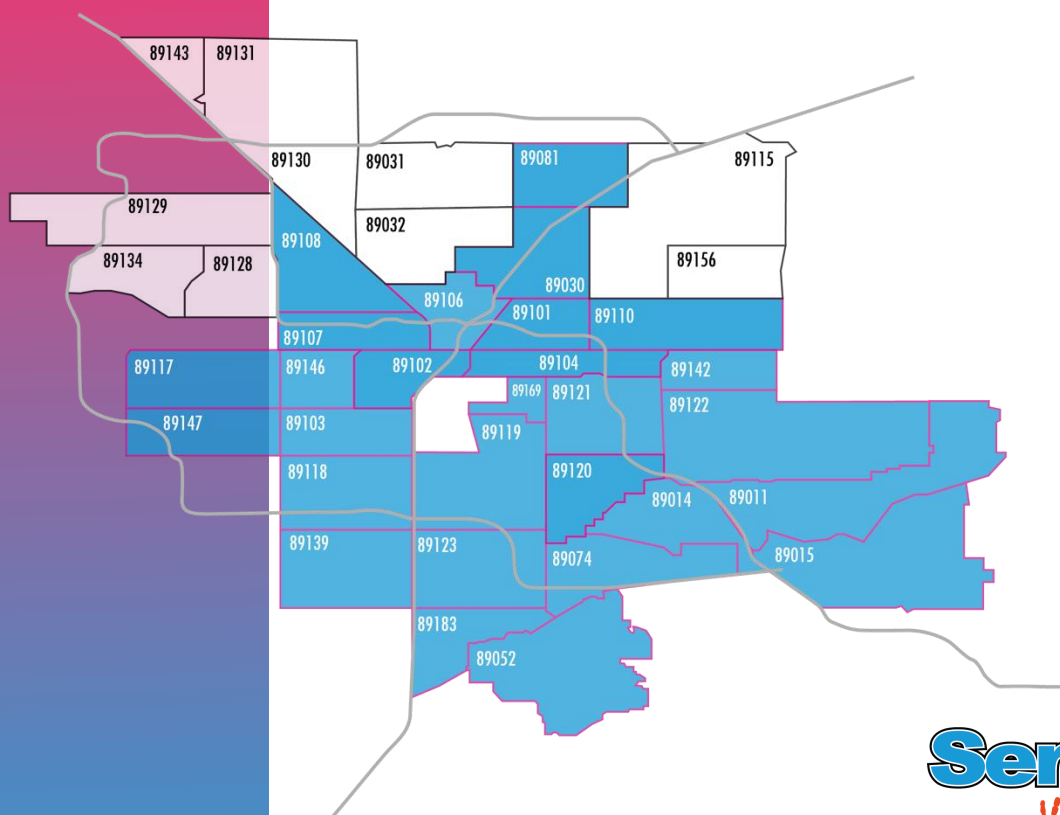

Our Story

Every day, more than 100,000 Clark County kids don't get enough to eat. School breakfast and lunch programs feed many of these kids during the school year, but few schools provide food assistance on weekends. This means thousands of kids leave school on Friday not knowing if they will eat again before Monday.

Every week during the school year, Serving Our Kids provides more than 4,500 weekend meal bags to 98 schools, Kindergarten – 8th grade throughout the Las Vegas valley.

When hungry kids are referred to Serving Our Kids, we feed them every week for the rest of the school year. No exceptions. They can feel more secure knowing that, regardless of how uncertain their lives are, they will always receive food every Friday.

Three Square is Southern Nevada's only food bank and largest hunger-relief organization. Its mission is to provide wholesome food to hungry people, while passionately pursuing a hunger-free community.

Three Square collects, packages, stores, and distributes food to a network of agency partners. These partners work on the front lines distributing food directly to people in our community. With the help of community supporters, volunteers, and more than 150 agency partners, Three Square operates several programs to feed hungry families and individuals across four counties.

Since 2022, Serving Our Kids and Three Square have been strategic partners, working together to optimize our operations and resources to best serve food-insecure elementary and middle school children throughout the valley.

Our partnership enables Serving Our Kids to source and purchase much of the food we include in our weekend meal bags at a lower cost. This helps us to make the most of the donations we receive and maximize the numbers of students we serve. Three Square has also provided generous in-kind donations to help support our operations.



Speedway Children's Charities (SCC) was founded by Speedway Motorsports, which currently owns and manages 11 outstanding professional motor racing venues across America, including the Las Vegas Motor Speedway.

To date, SCC has awarded more than \$65 million to nonprofit organizations throughout the country that directly serve the needs of children. Local SCC chapters work with local leaders and organizations to identify and address the issues affecting children in their communities.

Serving Our Kids is grateful to count SCC among our close community partners. The Las Vegas chapter has provided thousands of dollars in critical grant funding over the past four years.



The Power of Good is Always On

The NV Energy Foundation (NVEF) is the philanthropic arm of Nevada's largest public utility. It provides grants and sponsorships to nonprofit organizations that are effectively addressing some of the most difficult challenges facing NV Energy customers and their communities. These include hunger and food insecurity.

Sinclair Broadcast is a major sponsor of the Souper Bowl Caring Telethon in eight cities across the country. In 2023, Sinclair brought this annual event to Las Vegas. In 2023, New 3 selected Serving Our Kids as its charity partner.

The telethon has raised public awareness of our organization and our mission and raised thousands of dollars to help us feed food-insecure elementary and middle school children across the valley.

News 3 is the media sponsor of our annual golf tournament, hosted by Chief Meteorologist Bill Bellis. Serving Our Kids has also benefitted from Sinclair's corporate Day of Giving events, where everyone in the company joins together to serve the community. The KSLV team has helped us package 10,000 (and counting) weekend meal bags and participated in our annual Bowl-A-Thon fundraiser.

Ford Country is one of our oldest and most loyal community partners. Every two months for the past five years, their team of volunteers has helped us create thousands of weekend meal bags. The company also sponsored our annual Bowl-A-Thons and golf tournaments.

Each year, Ford Country (as a Gaudin Motor Company initiative) holds a community food drive benefitting Serving Our Kids. Their 2024 event alone brought in more than 13,700 food items that filled 1,524 weekend meal bags. In prior years, their food drives have featured members of the Las Vegas Raiders, which helped Serving Our Kids increase community awareness and engagement.

Our partnership with Ford Country is a model for all others. They contribute funding for our events, food from community initiatives and volunteers to help us provide weekend meal bags to the kids across the valley.



The partnership between **Shadow Hills Church (SHC)** and Serving Our Kids was formed long before we became an official non-profit organization. In our early years, SHC members volunteered to create and deliver weekend meal bags to schools in the neighborhoods around the church. Today, SHC delivers approximately 68,000 weekend meal bags to 18 high-need schools throughout the school year.

When we asked SHC to hold a holiday food drive to collect donations of two much-needed items for our weekend meal bags, they rose to the challenge. All of the 6,800 donations they received went directly into our meal bags. We would not be able to serve the more than 98 schools and thousands of hungry kids who rely on our help without this invaluable partner.

Our Partnerships

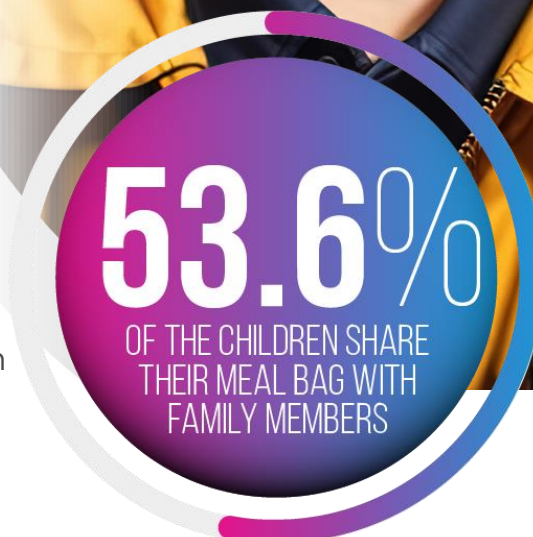

Our Results

Twice every school year, Serving Our Kids conducts surveys of the 98 Clark County schools that distribute our weekend meal bags to eligible elementary and middle school students. School meal bag coordinators provide feedback on our services, and on the impact of the weekend meal bag program on the children who consistently receive them. The most recent survey conducted in December 2025 with 96.9% participation showed the following results.

- 58% said they observed overall improvement in health and wellness
- 52% observed school attendance improvement
- 51.1% observed improvement in academic performance
- 53.6% of the children share their meal bag with other family members



Food Insecurity



What is Food Insecurity?

The lack of access, at times, to enough food for an active, healthy life.

– U.S. Department of Agriculture

The limited or uncertain availability of nutritionally adequate and safe foods, or the limited or uncertain ability to acquire acceptable foods in socially acceptable ways.

– The Journal of Nutrition

The consistent lack of food to have a healthy life because of your economic situation.

– Feeding America



Food Insecurity in The U.S.

According to Feeding America, a nationwide network of food banks, food pantries and local meal programs:

- 48 million people in the U.S. are food insecure
- **This includes 14.0 million children**

According to Feeding America and the U.S. Department of Agriculture, in 2024:

- 18 million U.S. households were food insecure at some time
- 7.3 million households with children were affected by food insecurity
- 33% of households headed by single mothers experienced food insecurity
- **7.3 million children (under 18 years old) lived in food insecure households**





Food Insecurity in Nevada.

According to statical data from Feeding America, in 2023:

- More than 136,000 Nevadan children were food insecure
- 81.6% of Nevada's food insecure children lived in Clark County, Nevada's largest county
- **More than 111,000 Clark County children were food insecure**
- **Nearly one in five Clark County children were not sure when their next meal would be and where it would come from**

Key Drivers of Food Insecurity

Several key factors prevent families from accessing sufficient nutritious food for all members, especially children:

Economic Instability: Financial hardships, such as low household income, unemployment or underemployment, are major causes. When families struggle financially, they may not have the resources to consistently purchase enough food, leading to periods of food insecurity. (U.S. Department of Agriculture)

The High Cost of Living: Many families living in areas where housing, healthcare and transportation are expensive have less money available for purchasing food. (The Economic Policy Institute)

Access Issues: Some families live in areas where fresh, affordable food is not readily available. Limited access to grocery stores that offer healthy food options can increase reliance on convenience store food or fast food restaurants that may not provide the nutritious meals children need. (U.S. Department of Agriculture)

Lack of Social Support: Insufficient access to social safety nets like food assistance programs (e.g., SNAP school meal programs) can cause food insecurity. Barriers to access include, being ineligible to receive

assistance, a lack of awareness, or the social stigma associated with using these services. (Feeding America)

Health Issues: Medical expenses or caring for a family member with chronic health conditions can be overwhelming. This can reduce the resources available for food. (Centers For Disease Control and Prevention)

Racial and Ethnic Disparities: Discrimination in the job market, income inequality and unequal access to resources result in higher rates of food insecurity in minority populations, especially among people of color. (Food Research and Action Center)

Educational Disparities: Parents with lower levels of education can have fewer opportunities to hold well-paying jobs. Lower income levels can result in increased food insecurity.

Food insecurity is considered a critical public health issue. Understanding these factors is essential for effectively addressing child food insecurity through public policy, community support programs and targeted interventions.



The Effects of Child Hunger Caused By Food Insecurity

Increased Health Problems

Children who do not receive sufficient nutrients are at a higher risk of serious health complications, such as stunted growth, weakened immune systems and increased susceptibility to diseases and infections. The lack of essential vitamins and minerals can severely affect a child's energy levels and cognitive functions.

Persistent hunger among children can lead to negative mental and emotional effects, such as higher rates of anxiety and depression. The stress of not knowing when or where their next meal will come from can create a state of constant worry and fear, which can hinder cognitive development and impair learning. Studies have shown that food-insecure children are more likely to struggle in school, have lower academic achievement and exhibit behavioral issues.

The social stigma associated with food insecurity can affect a child's self-esteem and social interactions. Food-insecure children are more likely to feel isolated or different from their peers. This can affect the development of effective social skills and lead to social withdrawal. The combination of physical, mental and social challenges feeds a cycle of debilitating health issues that can be difficult to break without timely and effective interventions.

Developmental Challenges

Food insecurity can have significant negative impacts on a child's physical and emotional well-being. The first few years of life are critical to the normal development of the body and mind. Inadequate nutrition can alter the brain's structure and impair its function. This can directly result in reduced:

- Cognitive and memory capacities.
- Language and motor skills.
- Abilities to concentrate, comprehend and learn.

Food insecurity also impacts emotional and behavioral development. Child hunger can induce stress responses, which can lead to long-term emotional problems. It can make food-insecure children:

- More prone to behavioral issues.
- Less able to develop social skills that help form healthy relationships, which can lead to social withdrawal and isolation.
- Less able to cope with the normal challenges of childhood and adulthood.

The Effects of Child Hunger Caused By Food Insecurity (cont'd)

Poor Academic Performance

Numerous studies consistently show that food-insecure students are more likely to experience difficulties in school compared to their peers who have regular access to nutritious meals.

- Children who are food insecure are more likely to score lower on standardized tests, especially in math.
- A report by the No Kid Hungry campaign found that hungry children are less able to focus on academics and are more likely to repeat a grade.
- According to the American Psychological Association, food insecure children are more likely to miss school and are 40% more likely to be suspended from school.
- Schools with higher rates of food insecurity among their students report higher dropout rates and less engagement in extra-curricular activities.
- Programs that address child hunger have been shown to improve attendance, cognitive performance and, ultimately, academic success.



Ensuring that children receive adequate nutrition is not only a matter of public health but also a critical component of educational policy and community support that fosters an environment where all students have the opportunity to succeed.



We're Feeding Their Dreams

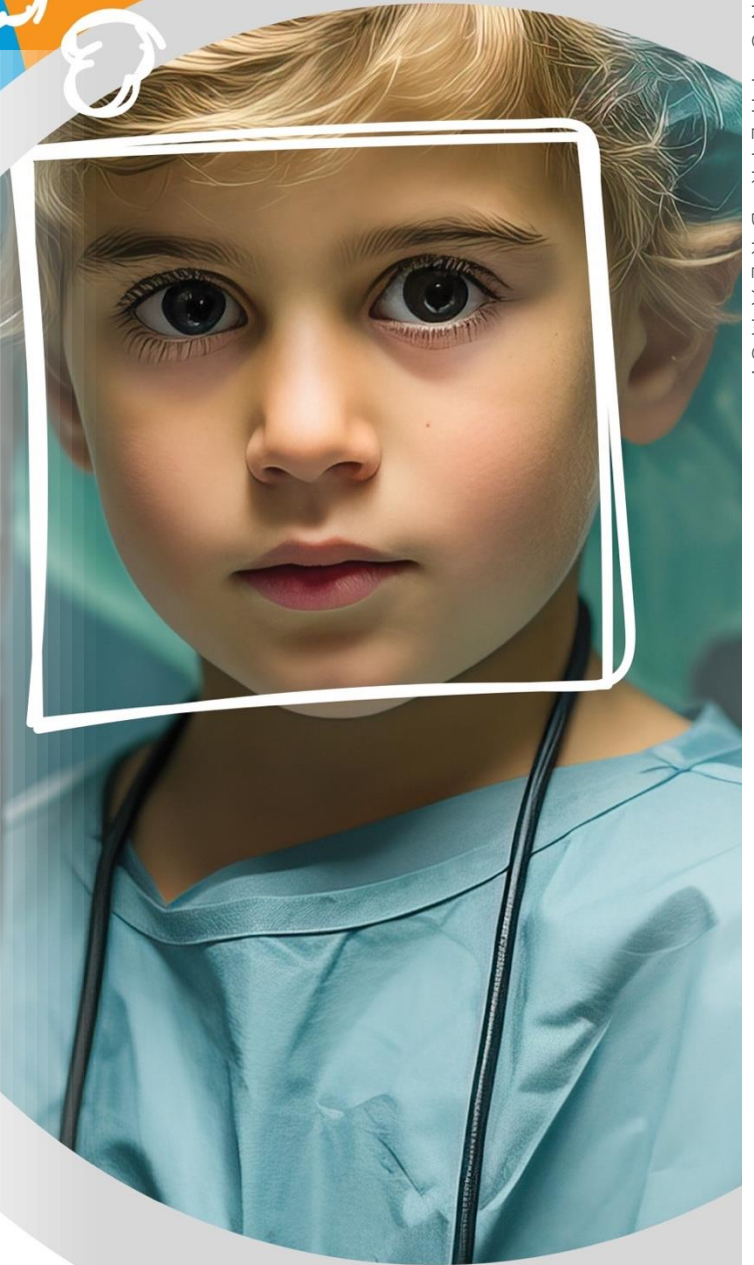
Serving Our Kids challenged the **Leadership Henderson Class of 2024** to meet three critical objectives:

1. Explode public awareness of the foundation and its mission to fight child hunger in the Las Vegas valley,
2. Significantly increase donations from individuals, corporations and sponsors, and
3. Significantly increase public awareness, participation and support for the foundation's three major annual fundraising events – The Souper Bowl of Caring Telethon, The Serving Our Kids Bowl-A-Thon and the Serving Our Kids Golf Tournament.

Leadership Henderson responded by developing a comprehensive, strategic marketing communications and fundraising plan designed to drive substantial growth throughout 2024 and beyond.

Class members also leveraged their relationships with valley businesses to secure in-kind and cash donations, provide more high-quality food for

weekend meal bags and help implement a new, integrated advertising and public relations campaign.



We're Feeding Their Dreams (cont'd)

The campaign's theme, **"We're Feeding Their Dreams,"** highlights a stark reality facing food-insecure children. While most kids dream of the future, hungry kids dream of food. Instead of looking forward to tomorrow, they are looking for their next meal. The Heart Behind the Mission: Volunteers Power Serving Our Kids Foundation's Fight Against Child Hunger

Community Volunteers Deliver Hope and Weekend Meals to More Than 4,500 Food-Insecure Children Each Week

LAS VEGAS, NV (May 2026) — They don't receive a paycheck. Most of them hold demanding full-time jobs. Yet week after week, a remarkable group of Las Vegas residents show up to pack meal bags, drive routes, and pour their hearts into ensuring that food-insecure children in Clark County don't go hungry on the weekends. They are the volunteers of Serving Our Kids Foundation — and without them, the organization simply could not exist.

Serving Our Kids provides weekend meal bags every week during the school year to more than 4,500 food-insecure elementary and middle school children across 98 schools in the Las Vegas Valley. More than 100,000 Clark County kids don't get enough to eat, and while school lunch programs provide a critical bridge during the week, thousands of children leave school on Friday not knowing when or if they will eat again before Monday.

Almost all of the organization's workers and professional staff, including its CEO, are volunteers. It is not a model born of necessity alone, it is a reflection of the community's deep commitment to its children.

"Our volunteers are the engine of everything we do," said Laurie Tanakaya, CEO of Serving Our Kids Foundation. "They are business professionals, realtors, parents, and neighbors who give their time because they believe no child in our community should go to bed hungry. Their generosity makes it possible for 70 cents of every donated dollar to go directly to the weekend meal bag program for the children we serve."

Serving Our Kids relies on volunteers for a wide range of roles from packing meal bags three nights a week at the warehouse, to driving delivery routes to schools across the valley, to leading outreach and fundraising efforts. Each role is essential.

Volunteers in Their Own Words

For volunteers like Cari Clark, a REALTOR® with Realty ONE Group in Las Vegas, the decision to get involved was grounded in both community and gratitude.

"Volunteering is important to me because it allows me to give back in a meaningful way and stay connected to my community," said Clark. "I believe small acts of kindness can make a big difference, especially for families who may be going through challenging times. It's also a great reminder of how fortunate we are."

Clark said the organization's mission is what drew her in. "I chose Serving Our Kids because of their direct impact on local children who may not have reliable access to food outside of school. Their mission really resonated with me, especially knowing how many kids in our own community face food insecurity. I love that the organization provides something so essential, and I wanted to be part of a cause that supports children in such a tangible and immediate way."

Patrick Stevenson, a REALTOR® with Realty ONE Group in Summerlin, echoes that sentiment. For him, the appeal was straightforward and deeply personal.

"Volunteering keeps me connected with our community and gives me a sense of purpose and gratitude," said Stevenson. "After sitting down with Laurie, I knew volunteering to deliver food to ensure kids don't go hungry was an easy decision."

Perhaps no story better captures the spirit of the organization than that of Tim Kuptz and his son Brandon. Tim, Broker/Owner of team KUPTZ RE/MAX Advantage and the #1 RE/MAX team in Southern Nevada, has been a Serving Our Kids volunteer driver and supervisor for five years. Today, he and Brandon alternate driving and supervising routes together each week, a father-son commitment that has become a cornerstone of the foundation's operations. Tim also steps in as an organizational spokesperson when CEO Laurie Tanakaya is unavailable for speaking engagements.

"I participated in a few meal bagging's before becoming a driver about five years ago," said Tim Kuptz. "Now, I alternate driving and supervising each week. And for the last few years, my son Brandon has been doing the same. I love the mission, the quality of the organizers and volunteers, and most important, the impact on food-insecure children Serving Our Kids provides. Good people. Great mission. Undeniable impact on the food-insecure children of our community. I love being a part of Serving Our Kids."

A Volunteer-Powered Model With Real Results

The results of Serving Our Kids' volunteer-powered model are clear. In a May 2026 survey of 98 school program coordinators across Clark County, respondents reported their observations regarding the weekend meal bags: improve students' overall health and wellness (58%), school attendance (52%), academic performance (51%) and an estimated 53.6% of students share the food they receive with family members.

The Foundation is now seeking volunteers across several key roles:

Volunteer Meal Baggers pack bags three nights a week during the school year.

Volunteer Drivers deliver meal bags to two to three schools every other week, with each delivery run taking approximately two hours.

Volunteer Leaders help supervise meal bagging to ensure consistency and compliance.

Event Volunteers support the foundation's three major annual fundraising events, and **Volunteer Ambassadors** share

the organization's story with local businesses and community groups to encourage participation and donations.

"Every bag packed, every meal delivered, every dollar raised by our volunteers represents a child who will face Monday morning with something to eat and maybe a little more hope," said Gregory Hogan, BOD Chairman. This would enable Serving Our Kids to provide 14,500 additional weekend meal bags for food-insecure children in 98 Clark County elementary and middle schools.
